Anguilla Regatta

10 - 12 May 2019 - Sailing Instructions



1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. Caribbean Regatta Safety and Equipment Regulations will apply.
- 1.3. For Racing and Cruising Classes the CSA Rating Rule will apply.
- 2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at the Roy's Bayside Grill.
- 3. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
- 3.1. Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted by 0830 on the day it will take effect except that a change to the Racing Schedule will be posted by 2000 on the day before it takes effect.
- 3.2. Changes to the start order may be made from the committee boat and broadcast on VHF or by hail.
- RADIO COMMUNICATIONS
 All radio communication will be on VHF channel 71.
- 5. SCHEDULE OF RACES
- 5.1. Dates and number of races scheduled:

6. CLASS FLAGS & ORDER OF STARTS

Order	Class	Class flag
1	Racing	Numeral 1 or Pink
2	Cruising	Numeral 2 or Blue
3	Multihull	Numeral 3 or Green

7. RACE AREA

- 7.1. On Friday, the Start will be in Simpson Bay and the Finish in Road Bay.
- 7.2. The location of the first Start on Saturday and Sunday will be posted by the time limit for amendments each day.
- 7.3. The location of the Finish for each race will be announced as part of the course if it is different from the location of the Start of that race.
- 8. THE COURSES
- 8.1. Attachment A describes the marks and their approximate location.
- 8.2. For each class the course will be announced by VHF or by hail from the committee boat.
- 9. MARKS
 - Marks of the course will be described by the RC when announcing the course.
- 10. COURSE RESTRICTIONS AND OBSTRUCTIONS

While racing no boat shall pass between Anguillita and Anguilla and that area shall be considered an obstruction.

11. THE START

The starting line will be between an orange flag or shape on the committee boat and a nearby mark.

- 12. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

 To change the next leg of the course, the race
 committee will display a 'C' flag and announce by VHF
 the changed course.
- 13. THE FINISH

The description of the finish line will be announced with the course and will be either:

- 13.1.between an orange flag or shape on the race committee boat and a nearby mark, or
- 13.2.between a mark in Road Bay and an orange flag displayed ashore near Roy's Bayside Grill.
- 14. PENALTY SYSTEM

For the Multihull and Cruising classes the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

- 15. TIME LIMIT
- 15.1. The time limit for all classes on Friday will be 1815.
- 15.2.On Sunday the time limit will be 1330.
- 15.3.Boats failing to finish within the time limit will be scored DNF. This changes RRS rule 35.
- 16. PROTESTS
- 16.1. For each class, the protest time limit is 60 minutes after the Race Committee arrives at Roy's Bayside Grill.
- 16.2. Arbitration may be used prior to a hearing.
- 16.3. Prior to a hearing a boat may accept a 30% Scoring penalty as described in RRS 44.3 c).
- 16.4.Except for breaches of Parts 1 and 2 of the RRS, the protest committee may apply any penalty that they deem equitable. This changes RRS rule 64.1.
- 17. SCORING
- 17.1. When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 17.2. When five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 17.3. For all classes one race must be completed to constitute a series.
- 18. PRIZES

Overall trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each class.

19. CONDUCT AND LIABILITY

The entrant will be responsible for all actions of her crew and guests.
